

Make students weakly accountable for showing up to sessions they have signed up for. Timeout from requesting sessions

No dramas if they cancel their sign up more than 24 hours before.



Students can only sign up to sessions in the next few days

Only run a session if it has more than X signups (kickstarter-esque model)



Tutor can assign a vague grade or difficulty level to each session



Encourage tutors we do have in underresourced timezones to reach out to their networks



Make tutors weakly accountable for rescheduling sessions with short notice.



Make it easy to follow a tutor after a student has had a good experience



Students can assign an indicator of their skill level when they request/register for a session

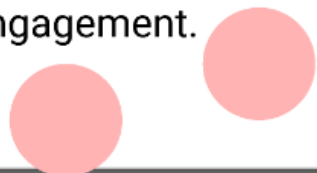

Students make topic requests and allocate along with it a number of “urgency” points. Highly urgent topics are suggested to tutors to create sessions. Students “urgency” points are earned through attendance and engagement.



Students follow topics that they’re interested in. Tutors then view demand by both topic and timezone.

Tutors schedule tentative sessions. If no students sign up, the session is canceled.

Students try to get others to join so the session isn’t canceled.



Tutors schedule timeslots where they will teach a given set of topics (that they know how to teach). The topic is decided automatically based on demand in the hours leading up to the session.

Students help each-other in a forum and come to a consensus about what topics they want to group themselves into. Then tutors volunteer to teach a session requested by a group of students.

Show students demand so they can see the likelihood of a session being scheduled in a topic. Have them rally for the topic they’re interested in.

Students need some way of knowing if a schoolhouse session will happen in time

Tutors put down their time and students sign up, students are automatically reminded of their session 24 hours in advance and told to either confirm their spot or give it up if no longer interested

Tutor set up recurring sessions based on their weekly availability (i.e. tutors are wedded to particular times), students can reasonably expect that to tutor to teach at the same time each week

Students offered the opportunity to form "class" communities based on the topic they are learning, tutors post their availability within that "class" and students sign up, also allow students to study together sans tutor if tutor is not available

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Based on past demand/common sense create a master template/calendar with time slots, tutors sign up for slots in the master calendar at the start of each week, allows SHW to ensure that sessions on similar topics occur on different days and that generally tutoring is spread out

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
